<u>Jezebel</u> -The sin alleged against her is the same for which the Nicolaitanes and to "the doctrine of Balaam." are condemned—fornication, and the eating of things sacrificed to idols, she misled into sins of idolatry and sexual immorality and seducing the servants of God. Being a follower of Baal, she promises to kill the prophet Elijah, who flees when hearing her plan, as did Ahab, "whom **Jezebel his wife** stirred up". (1 Kings 21:25).

<u>Balaam</u>, who taught Balak to entice the Israelites to sin so that they ate food sacrificed to idols and committed sexual immorality. When Balak offered more money, Balaam tried to change God's mind, but God commanded him to bless Israel. Then Balaam advised King Balak to draw Israel into intermarriage with heathen women and to commit idolatry. (Numbers 22—25).
